

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER Castlecomb (TX1330163), Kerr County, TX Chemical Monitoring, Routine Major 2023 & 2024

**CASTLECOMB WATER SYSTEM PWS 1330163** has violated the monitoring and reporting requirements set by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Chapter 30, Section 290, Subchapter F. Public water systems are required to collect and submit chemical samples of water provided to their customers and report the results of those samples to the TCEQ on a regular basis.

We failed to monitor and/or report the following constituent and Monitoring Periods:

Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water is safe from chemical contamination. We did not complete all monitoring and/or reporting for chemical constituents, and therefore TCEQ cannot be sure of the safety of your drinking water during that time.

## We are taking the following actions to address this issue:

CSWR – Texas experienced delays due to issues with the certified laboratory responsible for releasing and submitting sample results to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ). All required samples were collected as scheduled.
