

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER Mohawk Utility AZ0414030 Did Not Meet Treatment Requirements

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we did (are doing) to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor your water for turbidity (cloudiness). This tells us whether we are effectively filtering the water supply. Water samples for September showed 50 percent of turbidity measurements were over 1 NTU (Turbidity units). The standard is that no more than 5 percent of samples may exceed 1 NTU (Turbidity units) per month. Water samples for October showed 39 percent of turbidity measurements were over 1 NTU (Turbidity units). The standard is that no more than 5 percent of samples may exceed 1 NTU (Turbidity units) per month.

## What should I do?

- You do not need to boil your water or take other actions. We do not know of any contamination, and none of our testing has shown disease-causing organisms in the drinking water.
- People with severely compromised immune systems, infants, and some elderly may be at increased risk. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. General guidelines on ways to lessen the risk of infection by microbes are available from EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at 1-800-426-4791.

## What does this mean?

This is not an emergency. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. *Turbidity has no health effects. However, turbidity can interfere with disinfection and provide a medium for microbial growth. Turbidity may indicate the presence of disease causing organisms. These organisms include bacteria, viruses, and parasites which can cause symptoms such as nausea, cramps, diarrhea, and associated headaches.* These symptoms are not caused only by organisms in drinking water. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advice.

## What is being done?

The elevated turbidity was caused by a sudden change in water quality in the water we withdraw from the Wellton-Mohawk Irrigation Canal. The canal water quality has returned to a more normal level and we currently are providing you with water that meets the standard for turbidity. We have and will continue to evaluate the performance of our filtration equipment at the plant site to ensure that it is operating efficiently.
