

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Monitoring Requirements Not Met for Ocala Heights Subdivision (3424651)

Our water system recently violated a drinking water requirement. Although this incident was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did (are doing) to correct this situation.

*We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During **Quarter 3 2025** we did not monitor or test for Disinfection By – Products and, therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time.*

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time.

The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for, how often we are supposed to sample for [this contaminant/these contaminants] and how many samples we are supposed to take, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were (or will be) taken.

What is being done?

CSWR – Florida UOC monitors your groundwater quarterly for Disinfection By – Products or DBPs. Disinfection by-Products are created as a result of chemical reactions in the water when the water is disinfected. DBP sampling was missed for Quarter 3 of 2025. Make up samples are currently being collected and submitted to Florida Department of Environmental Protection. We have reviewed sampling requirements with operational staff to prevent a future sampling omission.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.
