

St. Johns Water Conservation & Water Management

CSWR-Florida is pleased to continue providing your community with safe, reliable, and environmentally responsible water service. Working together with the St. John's River Water Management District, we must ask our customers to please practice water conservation to best manage water resources and to ensure the efficient use of water for landscape irrigation.

A **Phase II Severe Water Shortage** has been declared by the St. John's River Water Management District due to ongoing dry conditions across portions of the district. The following Irrigation Schedule has been designed to ensure equitable and efficient use of water resources for landscape irrigation, with irrigation limited to ONE DAY a week as follows:

GROUP 1: Addresses ending with odd # (1, 3, 5, 7, 9) are permitted to irrigate on Saturday

GROUP 2: Addresses ending with even # or 0 (0, 2, 4, 6, 8) are permitted to irrigate on Sunday

Additionally:

- Water only when needed; do NOT water between 10:00 AM and 4:00 PM
- Irrigation is limited to no more than 3/4 an inch of water per zone, and no more than one hour per zone on your scheduled day
- Restrictions apply to private wells and pumps, ground or surface water, and water from public and private utilities

Landscape irrigation for areas NOT included in a water shortage are to follow:

GROUP 1: Addresses ending with odd # (1, 3, 5, 7, 9) are permitted to irrigate on

Wednesday/Saturday during DAYLIGHT SAVINGS, and Saturday during EASTERN STANDARD TIME

GROUP 2: Addresses ending with even # or 0 (0, 2, 4, 6, 8) are permitted to irrigate on

Thursday/Sunday during DAYLIGHT SAVINGS, and Sunday during EASTERN STANDARD TIME

GROUP 3: Non-residential properties are permitted to irrigate on Tuesday/Friday during DAYLIGHT SAVINGS, and Tuesday during EASTERN STANDARD TIME

Additionally:

- Water only when needed; do NOT water between 10:00 AM and 4:00 PM
- Irrigation is limited to no more than 3/4 an inch of water per zone, and no more than one hour per zone on your scheduled day
- Restrictions apply to private wells and pumps, ground or surface water, and water from public and private utilities
