CSWR-Florida is pleased to continue providing your community with safe, reliable, and environmentally responsible water service. Working together with the Southwest Florida Water Management District, we must ask our customers to please practice water conservation to best manage water resources and to ensure the efficient use of water for landscape irrigation.

A **modified Phase III “Extreme” Water Shortage** has been declared by the Southwest Florida Water Management District, in effect from April 3 through July 1, 2026. This is due to ongoing regional rainfall deficit and reduced water levels in the District’s water resources such as aquifers, rivers and lakes. The following Irrigation Schedule has been designed to ensure equitable and efficient use of water resources for landscape irrigation, with irrigation limited to ONE DAY a week from 12:01 am to 4 am OR 8 pm to 11:59 pm, as follows:

- If your address ends in 0 or 1, your irrigation day is MONDAY
- If your address ends in 2 or 3, your irrigation day is TUESDAY
- If your address ends in 4 or 5, your irrigation day is WEDNESDAY
- If your address ends in 6 or 7, your irrigation day is THURSDAY
- If your address ends in 8 or 9, or mixed addresses, your irrigation day is FRIDAY

Additionally:

- Residents may handwater plants, flower beds and shrubs any day before 8 am/after 6 pm
- During day 1-30, new lawns/plants may be watered any day of the week. During days 31-60, they may be watered 3 days during the week. Even numbered addresses may water on Tue, Thur, and Sunday; odd numbered addresses may water on Mon, Wed, and Saturday
- Fountains and other water features may only operate 4 hours per day
- Pressure washing in preparation for painting and sealing is allowed
- Car washing of fire trucks and other emergency vehicles is allowed
- Personal car washing at home is allowed on one’s irrigation day, with hand held hose
- Rinsing of boats and flushing of boat engines is allowed after use to remove salt water
- Golf course fairways and driving ranges may be irrigated once per week only
- Restaurants may serve water upon request
- The use of water for medical purposes or the protection of public health, safety and welfare is not restricted
