



**IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER
Failure to Meet Lead & Copper Rule Monitoring Requirements for Drinking Water

We are required to monitor your drinking water on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During a recent compliance period, we did not monitor or test as required and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time.

The table below lists the monitoring we did not conduct, how often we are supposed to sample and how many samples we are supposed to take, how many samples we took and when the samples should have been taken.

Required Monitoring	Required Monitoring Frequency	Number of samples taken	When all samples should have been taken

We are taking the following actions to address this issue:

Originally, five lead and copper samples were collected; however, one sample was taken from a vacant residence, which resulted in an invalid result at that sampling location. The sample result was invalidated, causing us to only have 4/5 samples completed for the sampling period.

Confluence Rivers has implemented new tracking methods for lead and copper sampling to improve monitoring accuracy and ensure compliance. Five out of five required samples were successfully completed in 2025, and we will continue to verify that all samples within each monitoring period are properly completed.
