Confluence Rivers has transitioned facility operations from contract operators to in-house operations and has implemented improved sample tracking procedures to ensure all required monitoring is completed on schedule.

A required VOC quarterly sample was missed during the fourth quarter of 2025. VOC sample results for the first and second quarters of 2026 were collected and found to be in compliance with all applicable regulatory requirements.

A required annual nitrate sample was not collected during the 2025 monitoring period. The most recent nitrate sample prior to this was collected in 2024. Historically, nitrate sample results for this facility have been in compliance with applicable regulatory standards. The next required nitrate sample is scheduled to be collected in 2026.
